

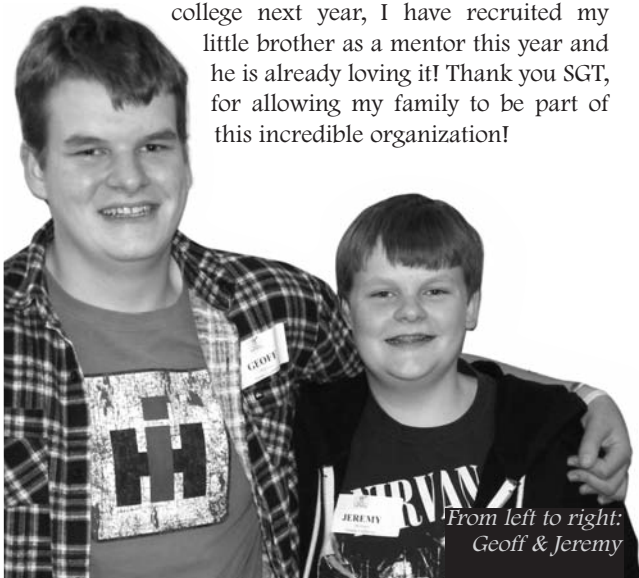
Peer Mentor Advisory Committee

Musical Theatre (10-21 years old)

Using the stage as a platform, this program enhances social & emotional literacy skills and increases self esteem. The students and their mentors practice character development, learn choreography, and perform stage work - all of which culminates into a full production for audiences of over 1,800!

Creative Drama Program (7-9 years old)

Through the use of drama activities including improvisation, story telling, and role playing, students develop the ability to empathize with the expressed emotions of others, explore creative thinking abilities, and gain confidence in using unscripted conversational skills. The final performance is scripted by the students themselves!

Early Childhood Program (3-6 years old)

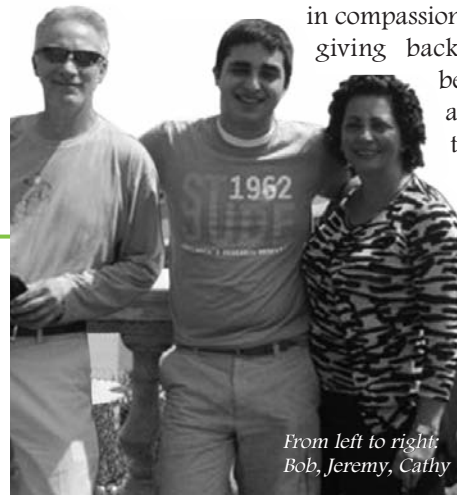
Providing active experiences compatible with a range of learning styles, children make connections to stories utilizing story dramatization, music and other multi-sensory experiences. The active learning opportunities focus in the areas of movement, language and early literacy development.

Peer Mentor/Buddy Program

Our unique Peer Mentor/Buddy Program consists of typically developing peers who work one-on-one with their SGT buddy on choreography, classroom activities, stage work and more! The program has proven to extend beyond the walls of SGT, as friendships, understanding and respect grow between the pairings and continue even after the SGT season is over!

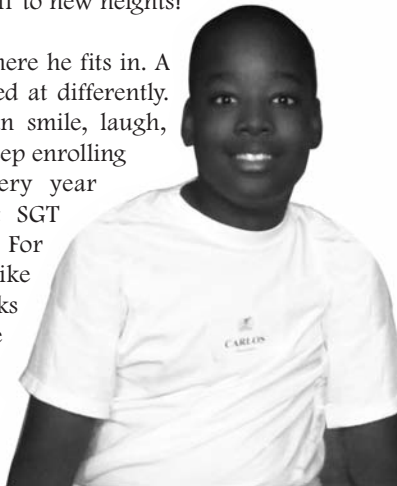

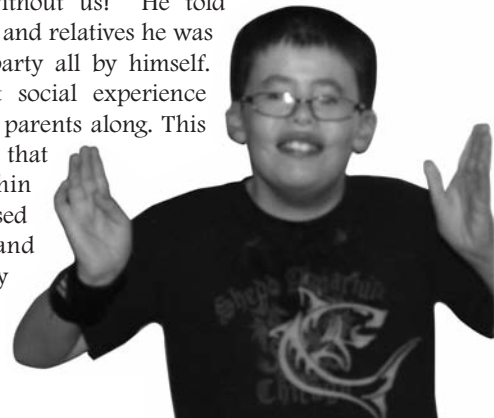

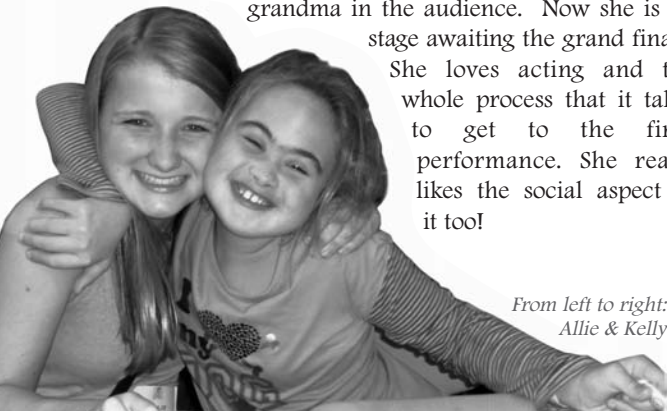


Kelly, SGT student
