Musical Theatre Teacher - Job Posting

Programs/Locations: Chicago (MTC), Libertyville (MTL), Wilmette/Winnetka (MTW)

Position Summary: This is a part-time seasonal position that utilizes musical theatre techniques to facilitate skill development for youth with intellectual and developmental disabilities. SGT teachers are responsible for providing a safe, nurturing and successful therapeutic and educational experience for all students in their class in all areas including the classroom, production and choreography components of the program season. Teachers co-write lesson plans, complete bi-weekly notes and tri-annual goal tracking, and facilitate engaging lesson plans on a weekly basis.

Reporting Relationships: This position reports directly to the Educational Manager or Program/Educational Manager at the program site.

Position Requirements: Weekly attendance on site throughout the season based on the program calendar for the Musical Theatre location. Program preparation and planning 1-2 hours per week from home. At times responsibilities will vary leading up to final performances including extended dress rehearsals, staff/production meetings, and cast celebration. A calendar will be provided with more detailed information with required days/times..

MTC meets on Thursdays after school from Sept-Feb at Ebinger School in Chicago

MTL meets on Tuesdays after school from Sept-Feb at Copeland Manor School in Libertyville

MTW Cast 1 meets on Mondays after school from Sept-March at Skokie School in Winnetka

MTW Cast 2 meets on Tuesdays after school from Sept-March at Loyola Academy in Wilmette

*Teachers are expected to arrive 15+/- minutes early to set up and clean up.

Key Responsibilities:

- Prior to the start of the season, review background information provided by parents on student's Comprehensive Registration Profiles (CRPs) and make necessary notes on students' bi-weekly note documents and initiate contact with parents.
- Create lesson plans and provide copies to the Educational Manager, or Program/Educational Manager each week.
- Write bi-weekly notes on every student in the class, remain in communication with parents/guardians (as needed), complete progress notes to go home, and goal tracking throughout the season.
- Collaborate with other SGT team members, Program Manager, Educational Manager, Peer Mentor Advisor, Production Manager, Choreographer, classroom aides, other

teachers and peer mentors with important information regarding adaptations and modifications to support your students.

- Learn the story of the selected production, as well as all choreography, lyrics, blocking, entrances and exits as well as all other aspects of selected SGT production.
- Support Production Manager and Choreographer during their sessions by assisting with activity and managing student behavior.
- Help students with achieving success in their selected part in the production, creating adaptations as needed.
- Support peer mentor/student pairs during class to promote engagement and assist with problem solving.
- Check email at multiple times per week to access important updates and information distributed to the SGT Team, during the season email responses are expected within 48 hours.
- Respond to and meet all deadlines as required for specific projects and reports as outlined on the Weekly Planner which will be provided prior to the start of the season.
- Responsible for helping strike the set and closing out the production with the rest of the team.

Skills and Qualifications:

- Bachelor's Degree from an accredited institution is required. Background in special education, early childhood, elementary, secondary, or theatre education is helpful. Backgrounds in therapeutic settings are also acceptable.
- Experience of 2-4 years teaching in a classroom environment or working with children with disabilities in some capacity is an asset.
- Self-motivated individual who can work independently.
- Excellent verbal, written, and organizational skills.
- Access to technology to use for planning, management and communications including Google applications.
- Basic knowledge of theater/production elements is helpful, but not required.
- Strong teamwork and interpersonal skills.
- A heart for individuals with disabilities and their families and believes in the mission of Special Gifts Theatre.

Salary: Range of \$1500 - \$2200 for the program season (commensurate with experience and length of season).
